I am the Leader of Preston City Labour Party.


We take decisions on how local services are run.

Labour will improve the Harris Museum and Art Gallery.




Labour will fund a Youth Zone facility to provide facilities such as sports hall, dance studio and multi-media suites.

Labour will work with the Police to tackle crime.




Valuing the whole community equally.
